MASSIVE FRESH INVESTMENT IN KETTERING GENERAL HOSPITAL

HM Government has reconfirmed to Kettering MP Philip Hollobone that KGH's place in the national New Hospitals Programme is secured with a £400m+ fully-funded, redeveloped, improved and expanded hospital due on the existing site by 2030.

With main construction due to start on schedule in 2028, initial early enabling works are **already under way** and the construction of a £34m net-zero new energy plant for the expanded hospital is due to start in spring 2024. The larger hospital will include a new urgent care hub to replace and enhance the existing A&E.

Kettering MP Philip Hollobone has been tirelessly pursuing this extra funding and is working closely with KGH itself to ensure the development proceeds as quickly as possible.
